Valentines for 70 years!

On January 21, Darwin and Evon Bleak of Mimbres celebrated one of the biggest milestones of their married life their 70th wedding anniversary.

Darwin and Evon met in Silver City in the late winter of 1949. Twenty-year old soldier Darwin Bleak, who was stationed at the White Sands Proving Ground, came to Silver City to visit his friends Don and Mildred Billings and their family. Don was friends with E. E. Ridling (aka Buttermilk) who owned a chain of service stations. Mr. Ridling had worked at the T & M Dairy in Hanover and he got the nickname Buttermilk. You will still see a Buttermilk service in Bayard.

Darwin needed gas, so he stopped at a Buttermilk service station (that is no longer there) but was someplace between JD Feed and the Chinese Fast food on Route 180 in Silver City.

And there she was, 16-year-old Evon Ridling was pumping gas -- the rest is history.

When asked if he asked her for a date on that trip, Darwin said, "No, it wasn't until he came back to Silver". He thinks that in the meantime there was a little scheming going on between his friends and Evon's family. When asked what attracted him to Evon, he said, "I was 20 and she was beautiful!"

Evon was originally from Mill Creek in the Ardmore/Tishomingo area of Oklahoma. Her family moved to Silver City in 1939. Evon attended school in Hanover where she was on the basketball

team. A picture of Evon with the basketball team is still on display in Dr. Arizaga's office in Silver City. Then she attended high school in Silver City.

Darwin was originally from Arizona. His stepfather was with the Forestry Service and they moved to the Tyrone area when he was in high school. He attended Silver City High School for his junior and senior years.

In 1946, there was a draft in the U.S. Fearing that he was going to be drafted, he persuaded his mother to sign the papers so he could enlist. If you enlisted, you could request what branch of the service you would be assigned and request where you would like to be sent overseas. Darwin se-

lected the Army and requested Alaska. So, as is the Army's custom, he was sent to Guam! He was assigned to Army Ordnance and became a small weapons mechanic. He can still remember his MOS# (Military Occupation Serial Number).

Evon and Darwin were married on January 21, 1950, at the Baptist Church in Hanover before 20 or 30 of their friends and relatives. The Church was a little east of what used to be the Manhattan Bar. All that is left of the church are some stone steps.

Darwin had many different professions over the years. He was a cowboy (the job he preferred if he could have made a living at it), mechanic, mine worker, fence builder, and well driller. He worked for Porter Oil in Bayard for 30 years. Darwin attended night school at WNMU and received a degree in Fine Arts. Then he went

on to get his Masters in Secondary Education. He was a teacher of Art and English in the Cobre School System for 25 years. He taught many of the people who are still in the valley today, Billy Lee, the Ebys, the Bounds, the Roybals, the Montoyas, etc. He retired in 1991.

Around 1958 Darwin and Evon moved north for a couple of years and Evon attended Cosmetology School. Evon was a beautician and ran her own beauty salon at 402 Poplar street in Bayard for 50 years.

The couple has two children. A son, Danny, who now lives in Phoenix after retiring from Freeport-McMoRan. Their daughter, Denise, lives in Canyon County, California. They have eight grandchildren and two great – grandchildren



AARP TAX-AIDE FOUNDATION IS BACK TO TAKE THE STRESS OUT OF FILING YOUR TAX RETURNS By Mary Willhite

Once again, locally trained and IRS certified volunteers of the AARP Tax-Aide Foundation are here to help you file your federal and/or New Mexico state income tax returns for FREE. Sounds too good to be true. Well, it's not! AARP has over 5,000 locations in the U.S. helping people file their returns.

Unfortunately, this year, due to lack of staff in this area and new security regulations from AARP, the volunteers can no longer prepare tax returns at the Mimbres location. Taxpayers who used the Mimbres location last year are encouraged to make an appointment at the Bayard or the

Silver City location.

There have been other changes since last year. There is now a new automated appointment system available on-line where you can book your own appointment (see instructions below).

Four of the local volunteers did not return this year. One retired after 12 years, two because of illness, and one who moved to Las Cruses to attend school. However, they have been replaced with four very capable new volunteers.

This year, tax returns will be prepared by appointment only at the following locations, dates and times.

** Please note that the phone numbers are different for each site. Phone messages will be returned within two days.

To make an appointment with our new automated appointment system, which we encourage. It is very simple, and it saves the volunteers time that they can be spending with more clients.

Answer the questions and select a date and time

If you have entered your email, you will get a reminder the day before your appointment

Or, if you don't have access to a computer or long distance on your phone, you can drop by one of the locations on a day that tax returns are being prepared and make a future appointment.

The volunteers can prepare most tax returns. There is no age or income limit and you do NOT have to be a

member of AARP. Volunteers are unable to file complex tax returns such as married filing separately, rental property (except for land), or if you have a small business with expenses over \$25,000, or you have a Health Insurance Savings Plan. You will need to see a paid preparer to help you with these matters.

Even if you do not need to file a tax return, you may be able to get a rebate from the State of New Mexico. You should probably make an appointment if you fall into one of the two categories below.

If you made less than \$22,000 in 2019, you would probably receive between \$20 to \$120 + depending on your filing status and income.

Also, if you were 65 years of age or older in 2019, and you made less than \$16,000 in 2019, you may receive an additional property tax or rent rebate up to \$350 depending on the amount of your taxes or rent.

The AARP volunteers are looking forward to serving you this tax season. Remember this service is free and the volunteers CANNOT accept donations or tips!



FOREST SERVICE NEWS



TRASH PICKUP SUSPENDED

The Gila National Forest, Wilderness Ranger District has suspended the trash service at the Sapillo Campground for the winter season. The dumpster has been removed and visitors are being asked to not dispose of trash in the fire rings or leave it in the campground area. This action will be reevaluated in the spring when seasonal recreational staff may be available to assist with trash pick-up.



"For the past number of years, the Wilderness Ranger District has provided trash service at the Sapillo Campground" said District Ranger Rachelle Huddleston-Lorton. "Due to financial and staffing constraints we are unable to continue that through the winter. I am asking our visitors to please "pack it in and pack it out" so that we can keep the campground open through the winter."

CAMPGROUND CLOSURES

The Gila National Forest, Silver City Ranger District has temporarily closed three campgrounds, **effective immediately**.

The following campgrounds are temporarily closed:

- Iron Creek Campground, located in the Black Range Mountains off NM State Highway 152
- Cherry Creek Campground, located off NM State Highway 15
- McMillan Campground, located off NM State Highway
 15

"We have had to close these campgrounds due to safety concerns due to previous inclement weather. We encourage forest visitors to check weather and road conditions prior to heading out on the Forest" said Beth Ihle, District Ranger. Visitors should also be mindful of hazards that can be present during the colder months, such as sudden weather and temperature changes and falling trees due to windy and/or snowy conditions. To find out about the roads that are typically closed during the winter season or more information about any of the campgrounds, please contact the local ranger district.

GILA FORESTS DRAFT MANAGEMENT PLAN

The Notice of Availability which marks the official release of the Gila National Forest's draft revised management plan and draft environmental impact statement will be published in the Federal Register on January 17, 2020. The Notice of Availability will also identify the date the official comment period ends. Tarantula Hawks

Did you know that New Mexico has an official state insect? Do you know what it is? It's a species of tarantula hawk known as *Pepsis grossa*. Tarantula

hawks belong to a larger group of wasps called 'spider wasps'. Adult spider wasps are vegetarians and can often be observed during the summer feeding on nectar from flowers or sugars from fruits. However, their maggot-like young (known as larvae, singular larva) are carnivores and feed on spiders. Tarantula hawk larvae feed on tarantulas, the largest spiders found in our area. Tarantula hawk females fly low over the ground to locate tarantula burrows, and when a burrow is found, the wasp carefully enters, which provokes the tarantula to exit. Once outside, the tarantula raises its front legs, exposing its fangs in preparation for a fight. The wasp quickly jumps onto the tarantula, inserts her stinger and injects a venom. The venom rapidly paralyzes, but does not kill, the tarantula. The wasp then drags the large spider back to its burrow, lays a single egg on the tarantula and then covers the burrow entrance with soil. Fertilized eggs become females and unfertilized eggs become males. A larva emerges from the egg, burrows into the abdomen of the tarantula and begins feeding, avoiding vital organs until dessert time so that the tarantula remains alive and fresh until the larva is fully grown. The larva then transforms into a pupa, from which an adult will emerge in 2-3 weeks.

Pepsis grossa, the state insect pictured above, is quite common in the Valley and has two color forms, one with orange wings and the second with black wings. Both forms have black bodies, antennae and legs. In my experience, the orange-winged form is more common in our area. Female Pepsis grossa can reach 2 inches in length, while males are somewhat smaller, attaining a length of about 1.5 inches.

Be careful around tarantula hawks! Only females sting and they are not highly aggressive, but if you do get stung, the pain has been described as "Blinding, fierce, and shockingly electric. A running hair dryer has been dropped into your bubble bath. A bolt out of the heavens. Lie down and scream" by Justin Schmidt, an entomologist at the USDA Bee Research Center in Tucson, Arizona. With such a powerful sting, it's not surprising that tarantula hawks have very few enemies, one of the few being the roadrunner, which just happens to be New Mexico's state bird.

TEACHER, CINDY LEE, WINS TEACHER OF THE YEAR AWARD

The New Mexico Farm and Livestock Bureau awarded science teacher, Cindy Lee, its Teacher of the Year Award. Though technically not an Ag Teacher, in her 26 years of teaching science at the Cobre Middle School in Bayard, she has always championed the field of agriculture in her science classroom. A lot of this she does through hands-on practical assignments that involve agriculture. Her students are presently raising chickens and have a greenhouse where they raise strawberries. The chicken coop and greenhouse were obtained from grants she wrote and received.

Cindy always takes advantage of any agricultural opportunities where her students can participate. She takes them to the Grant County Fair, the Southern New Mexico State Fair in Las Cruces, and Ag Career events at NMSU. Over the years, she has attended many Ag in the Classroom workshops, one of which included a trip to Mexico and the National Ag in the Classroom Workshop in Albuquerque.


It is quite an honor to be named Teacher of the Year






San Lorenzo Students Began Two Projects in January

The Australia Project.

The kids decided they wanted to do something to help the animals who have been displaced by the fires in Australia. Fabric was purchased and with the help of some great staff members and volunteers, the kids have begun cutting out and sewing - both by hand and by taking turns on a sewing machine - pouches for wallabies and kangaroos. 
The Monument, Gran Quivira, Abo, and Quarai, includes three locations in the foothills of the Manzano Mountains in an area known as the Estancia Basin, and preserves three Pueblo Indian ruin sites and four Spanish missions. The basin, in central New Mexico, was once a lake that dried up and left good soil for the Pueblo Indians to cultivate crops like corn, beans and squash. The name, "Salinas", comes from a series of salt lakes in the basin. Salt was an important trade item in prehistoric and historic times. The area was also known for its large herds of pronghorns, commonly called <u>antelopes</u>. Indians hunted the animals for their meat and hides. The hides became an important export item for the Spaniards. The pueblos and
