#### SAN LORENZO ELEMENTARY SCHOOL NAMED TO SECRETARY'S SCHOOL HONOR ROLL

We are accustomed to reading in *The Messenger* that San Lorenzo Elementary School has been recognized for one or another academic achievements. Most everyone in the Valley recognizes what a special thing we have going on at San Lorenzo. Apparently, the New Mexico Board of Education agrees. The school has garnered numerous awards and recognitions, including four straight A's and its teachers were deemed "exceptional instructors". The most recent recognition of quality and achievement by San Lorenzo Elementary

is its inclusion on last year's Education "Secretary's School Honor Roll". Of all the schools in the state, only ten are named on this list, and San Lorenzo is one.

When notified of the honor roll award, Principal Michael Koury said, "I have had the privilege of serving as principal of San Lorenzo for the past five years. We have just received an unbelievable honor being placed on a list of the top ten best schools in the state of New Mexico. I would like to congratulate the students, staff and families for their hard work and dedication over the years."

At the end of 2018, outgoing Secretary of Education Christopher Ruszkowski announced the first-ever "Secretary's School Honor Roll" highlighting schools from across the state for everyone to celebrate, visit and study further. The Secretary of Education visited all 89 school districts and hundreds of schools and class-rooms across the state. Evaluations were based on multiple years of school performance, the degree to which the school serves students from low income communities and the innovative and evidence-based practices observed by the Secretary during his visits. The hope is that this evaluation practice will become a tradition, with an annual honor roll and that such schools

will become open-door labs of learning and innovation – places that fundamentally change the collective consciousness around what is possible for all students, regardless of background.

San Lorenzo Elementary is in good company on the honor roll list. Each of the selected schools earned an "A" in the most recent school year. San Lorenzo and Mission Achievement and Success in Albuquerque have each earned four consecutive "A" ratings. The vast majority of the schools on the list serve communities that are

over 80% low-income. We should also note that Jose Barrios in Silver City also made the list, and guess who was the principal there for twelve years before coming to San Lorenzo? Our own Michael Koury.

Outgoing Education Secretary Rusz-kowski supports the continuation of this evaluation process and naming annual honor rolls and hopes that his successors visit the schools, celebrate and champion our state's best schools and classrooms through a combination of reviewing student achievement data and onsite observation. Secretary Rusz-

kowski said "We should learn from the best and design for excellence. This collection of schools is often beating the odds, are the most innovative, and are proving that demographics do not define our students' educational and life outcomes. Once you visit one of these schools you will be forever transformed. And once you see students' academics and trajectories and lives being fundamentally changed in one school, you inevitably ask yourself the question: Why doesn't every school do what these schools are doing?"

We are proud of our local school, its principal, teachers, staff and students. All of them work hard for our Valley kids, and we appreciate and congratulate them.

The Wertz Gourd Farm in Casa Grande, Arizona hosted the 16<sup>th</sup> Annual Running of the Gourds Competition and Festival on February 8<sup>th</sup> through the 10<sup>th</sup>. The festival brings visitors and competitors from all around the United States and Canada. Not only are there tons of gourds entered in the competitions, there is great food and music as well as gourds galore and supplies for the artists. The festival is well worth the drive to Casa Grande. Meg Streams attended this year's festival and came a way a big winner.

Meg has always been a very talented artist, she has only been using gourds as a medium for the past six years. However, she is already at the Masters Level. Meg entered three pieces and everything she entered won top honors in the Masters Division.

Meg's pride and joy this year is the "Party Bug" which was inspired by Meg's friend Mary Bailey. Mary has rescued more than 24 dogs and one cat, and she owns a 1973 Beetle! The "Party Bug" is filled with nine dogs and one cat going on a joy ride. When you look at the intricacy of the piece,

it is not hard to image that it took a year to complete, and in Meg's own words, "It was a labor of friendship, love and gourds!" There should be no doubt in anyone's mind why this gorgeous piece won two awards, Best of the Masters Division as well as the Peoples Choice (which is the hardest category to win). If you want to get a first hand look at the beautiful piece, you will have to take a ride to Sierra Vista, Arizona and to go to *Grandma's Kennel* where the "Party Bug" now resides.

Her other two entries also took top honors. "Rattled" which took 1<sup>st</sup> Place on the Master Division in the Wildlife Class.

Then there is "It's a Dry
Heat" – the Jack Rabbit Welcoming Committee. This
took 1<sup>st</sup> Place in the Arizona
Theme Masters Division

If all these awards weren't enough, last year Meg's entry was a "Trio of Lionfish" which won Best of Show. That qualified for an entry into the National Best of Show competition where the entries were all Best of Show winners nationwide. Not



surprisingly, Meg won the American Gourd Society Artisan Award!

What's next? Meg confessed that after the festival and working on these award-winning projects for the past year, she was at a loss for what to do next. Then she remembered a project she started when her children were babies (they are now in college) which she had never finished and hasn't worked on in years. Besides being a master gourd craftsman, she is also a very talented wood carver. She started carving a full-size carousel horse. One of her goals now is to finish the horse.

Her other goal is to start an online Etsy Shop and to find a local gallery to display her artwork. Meg is very prolific and always has beautiful items for sale and to display.



She was also made an

honorary member of The Southwest Gourd Association and she plans to help at next year's festival and perhaps judge. Then in her spare time, as always, she will be helping Dale with his vet work in the valley. Meg is not only one talented lady, she is one very busy lady.

## Tommyknocker Mountain Bike Race to be held on Fort Bayard Trail Systems

The Tommyknocker 10-hour mountain bike race will be held on the Gila National Forest's Fort Bayard Trails system on Saturday, March 9, starting at 8:00 a.m. and ending at 6:00 p.m. The event officially opens to campers and participants on Friday, March 8.

The bike race will utilize 122 - 15 miles of designated Forest Service trails in the Fort Bayard area, excluding the Dragonfly Loop. Don't wish to ride? Other trail opportunities can be found at signal peak, Gomez Peak, and the Burro Mountain trails systems. The event is north of U.S. Highway 180 through the Fort Bayard area to the Servis Corral Trailhead.

#### The Gila, a Wild and Scenic River

"The Gila River is a crown jewel of the Southwest and one of the last remaining free-flowing rivers in the United States. The river provides amazing opportunities for recreation, wildlife habitat protection, and has unique historic value." -----Senator Tom Udall



"In my corner of the Land of Enchantment, the Gila River is the state's last free-flowing river. It draws in visitors and residents that support our local economy." ---- Lt. Governor Howie Morales

Many people living here in southwest New Mexico are concerned about the future of the Gila River. River advocates are supporting a campaign to designate the Gila as a Wild and Scenic River.

What does such a designation mean?

The following is from wildgilariver.org and from the *Keep the Gila Wild and Scenic The Way It's always Been* pamphlet:

- ♦ The Gila River is the lifeblood of New Mexico-the last freeflowing major river in the state.
- Area farmers depend on clean water and a healthy river for their crops and for their traditions and livelihoods.
- The Gila is unmatched for outdoor activities hiking, hunting and fishing; a place where people can go to enjoy the beauty of nature.
- The Gila is a witness to the history of New Mexico: its canyons, cliffs, and cottonwood groves are home to historic native American and early pioneer sites.
- The Gila is a source of jobs and revenues, supporting tourism and outdoor recreation as a foundation of the local

- economy. Designation as "Wild and Scenic" would not change existing water rights or irrigation systems, nor would the designation limit access to public lands, or open access to private land. Hunting and fishing regulations would not change.
- The "Wild and Scenic" designation is a way to give voice to New Mexicans that want to protect places that contain the best scenery, fish and wildlife habitat, and historic treasures.

Did you know that 14 native fish live in the Gila River basin, including four that live nowhere else in the world? The Gila is prized for its wildlife habitat and hunting opportunities, including word-class elk, mule deer, Coues deer (white-tail), and wild turkey. Locals and visitors alike enjoy camping, rafting, backpacking, hiking, hunting, fishing, birding, horseback riding, and soaking in hot springs. The headwaters of the Gila begin in America's, and the world's, first Wilderness Area. People from all over can enjoy the river and the surrounding natural beauty of the forest.



When you throw babies in the air, they laugh because they know you will catch them. That's TRUST.


Every night we go to bed without any assurance of being alive the next morning, but still we set the alarms to wake up. **That's HOPE.**



# Conejo Mimbreño Visits El Malpaís National Monument

El Malpaís National Monument, south of Grants, is called the "badlands" of New Mexico. The area is very dry and the soil is volcanic and rocky. There are amazing land formations that resulted from volcanic activity.



Ancient trails used by Native Americans cross the landscape through rough terrain-lava flows and <u>l</u>ava tu<u>b</u>es are mixed with stands of pon<u>d</u>eros<u>a</u> pines and sce<u>n</u>ic views. There are <u>signs</u> of past hum<u>a</u>n habitation, such as prehistoric ruins and homestea<u>d</u> sites.

## Protecting Prehistoric Rock Art Sites Apeal from the National Forest Service

Gila National Forest is home to over 200 recorded prehistoric rock art sites. Rock art is extremely fragile, once damaged the site can never be repaired to its original condition. Visitors to the rock art sites across the Gila National Forest may notice that these places have not always been respected. Damaging rock art sites reflects the disrespect of a few for a cultural history that belongs to us all—a history that the Gila National Forest is mandated to protect.

Rock art sites are considered sacred by many people. There are two types of rock art: petroglyphs (motifs that are pecked, ground, incised, abraded, or scratched on the rock surface) and pictographs (paintings or drawings in one or more colors using mineral pigments and plant dyes on the rock surface). The patterns and motifs may be similar, but are never quite the same. Styles vary from place to place, and from culture to culture.

Each of us has the opportunity to do our part to protect this heritage for future generations. Please follow the rock art etiquette guidelines below when visiting rock art sites.

#### Rock Art Etiquette

Avoid touching the rock art or surfaces around it. Surprising as it may seem, the oils in a single handprint can chemically affect the rock surface.

- Do not apply any substance to the rock art surface, including water or any other fluids.
- · Although you may think that you are helping others to see the rock art, do not trace images with sticks, stones, chalk, or other substances.
- · We appreciate your care and concern for rock art sites, but do not attempt to remove graffiti, chalking, lichen, bird droppings, or anything else from rock art. Site repair can be made more difficult by the good intentions of those without technical expertise.
- Do not collect or disturb artifacts or features at rock art sites.
- Speak out to prevent damage to rock art and report new rock art destruction.

Archaeological sites are fragile, irreplaceable, and protected by law. The Archaeological Resources Protection Act (ARPA) of 1979 protects sites for the benefit of all. This law states that it is illegal to collect or disturb archaeological materials on public land without a permit issued from the appropriate land managing agency, and this includes collecting arrowheads or other isolated finds. Violators will be subject to civil and criminal penalties, including 10 years in prison, a maximum fine of \$250,000.00 and confiscation of vehicles and equipment used in committing the crime.

We thank you for appreciating and respecting these very special places and for helping others do the same.



Some of the ways targeted to do that are by improving communication and social networks, providing preventive health education, improving access to health and social services, increasing financial and economic stability, increasing recreation opportunities, increasing education opportunities, and promoting a safe and healthy environment.
