MIMBRES VALLEY to GET OVERPASS - By Kate Brown

Cobre Haul Road and Highway 152 Overpass: Cobre Mine to Chino Mine

A giant new item of mining infrastructure and other major changes are about to appear on Hwy 152 near Hanover. Freeport McMoRan will begin construction of an overpass that will be at least 124 feet wide over Hwy 152, about 1 mile southwest of the mine overlook. During the construction period, which is expected to span nine months from late September 2017 to late June 2018, a detour road approximately 2100 feet in length will carry traffic north of the highway, inside what is now the mine fence. This road will be paved and the speed limit will be 35 mph.

At this time, red highway barrel markers along the highway before Hanover signal the up-coming construction and the speed limit is reduced to 45mph.

The first phase of the construction of the detour road will entail 15-minute delays on 152 during blasting near the road for the material to build the detour. This is scheduled for sometime in August or September.

Once the detour road is in place, work on the haul road and over pass will begin in earnest and will entail considerable blasting just east of Fierro Canyon. The material blasted for the haul road will become the material for the overpass. The overpass will span Hwy 152 and will be large enough for two lanes of huge mine ore trucks, plus berms on both sides that will be approximately 12 feet high and 12 feet wide, to prevent the trucks falling onto the highway. The total width will be at least 124 feet.

A polymer dust suppressant will be sprayed to reduce dust on the unpaved haul road, where pavement is not possible because of the weight of ore trucks when filled to capacity. According to the Caterpillar website the 793F Mining Truck has a Gross Machine Operating Weight of up to 860,000 pounds.

The haul road between Cobre Mine and Chino Mine will be 3.5 miles long. Depending on the price of copper, mining is expected to continue for five years, with a truck passing over Hwy 152 every two minutes, twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week.

The design of this overpass is expected to be similar to the one pictured here, found on a Google search: "mine haul road bridge New Mexico".



One of the sites of the expanded mining of Cobre Mine will be Hanover Mountain, which is full of copper and will be removed from the landscape. Since the waste rock stockpiles will become high and are west of the Mimbres Valley, residents may expect elevated levels of dust when the wind is blowing. The company stresses that they are obligated to comply with their permitting, which by law limits dust emissions.

Freeport McMoRan hosted a community open house at Hanover Outpost on July 21 to answer questions about this expansion. They want to know if area residents are bothered by noise, vibration or air quality from dust.

A second open house is scheduled for August 29, 4:40-5:30 at the Grant County Annex Building on Hwy 180 (behind of Burger King). A state public hearing will follow immediately. Also, concerns can be addressed to Kevin Cook, Manager for Community Development, 575 912 5215, kcook@fmi.com.

We at *The Mimbres Messenger* mourn the loss of the *blackrange.org* website where Bob Barnes posted *The Messenger* (in color) every month since 2014 for online viewing. Sadly, that is no longer possible. Bob's excellent website (including *The Monticello Messenger, Hillsboro Historical Society Newsletter, Black Range Rag Newsletter,* many photographs, historical and current events, nature articles and works of numerous authors) has been virtually wiped out by a variant of the Russian hackers' Petya virus which was used to attack the Ukraine recently.

The virus attacks specific types of data and the version that hit the Black Range Website targeted website data. The fast-spreading virus, disguised as ransomware, was really all about erasing data. Unfortunately, it was very effective, following to back-up disks. Ransomware is a hacker's tool for extorting money from its victims. Viruses disguised as ransomware are even more insidious.



The lost data represents ten years of work – not from date to date, but actual hours. Recovery and changes or additions to these websites are not possible. This cyber attack is akin to, if not worse than, senseless book burning.

The only somewhat positive note is that Bob was able to salvage some website data that was hosted externally (do not ask me to explain this) through the date of the disaster, June 28, 2017. *The Messenger* issues from 2014 through June, 2017 will remain available online until at least 2/18/19 at <u>blackrange.org</u>. But future issues can no longer be posted to the website.

All of us who have so enjoyed *The Messenger* online and benefited from Bob's hard work extend our sympathies on the loss of the fruits of his labors. We also extend our heartfelt thanks for all of his much-appreciated efforts on our behalf. As Bob said when notifying us of the situation: "It has been an interesting and successful ride but now it is over."

We are pleased this month to include contributions by non-staff writers who have responded to our pleas for articles of local (and other) interest. There are still many folks out there who have worthwhile knowledge, experience and ideas that would be of interest to all of us. Please share.

FREE DIABETES PROGRAM By Judy O'Loughlin

New Mexico State University's Grant County Cooperative Extension Service will offer a free six-week Diabetes Self-Management Program (DSMP) starting on August 10. Developed and tested by Stanford University, the DSMP has been proven to improve health and quality of life for adults with diabetes and pre-diabetes.

The DSMP helps adults with diabetes learn how to manage and improve their health through interactive workshop sessions focusing on problems that are common to individuals dealing with diabetes. Throughout the six weeks, participants focus on building skills to manage their conditions by sharing experiences and providing mutual support. Topics include monitoring blood glucose levels, healthy eating, physical activity, stress man-

agement, relaxation, medication use, difficult emotions, problem solving and communicating with doctors.


The weekly sessions will be held from 9:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. each Thursday August 10, 17, 24, 31, and Sept 7, and 14, at the Grant County Extension Office, located at 2610 N. Additional Fuelwood now available on Wilderness Ranger District

The Gila National Forest, Wilderness Ranger District has two additional fuelwood areas now available on the district.

There are approximately 60 acres of additional dry ponderosa pine on the ground in the Gattons Park area. This area is being thinned by the Wilderness RD fire crew to improve forest health, reduce fuels in the Wildland Urban Interface and improve wildlife habitat. This fuelwood would be appropriate for gathering for use as campfire wood, and is available for that use without a permit. The Gattons Park unit is accessible from Hwy 35 at approximately mile marker 17 and Forest Road 4085X.

There are approximately 445 acres on the ground in the McKnight deadwood area and it is almost all juniper with some ponderosa pine. This wildlife habitat improvement project was contracted through New Mexico State Forestry and the funding originated with NM Game & Fish. This area is accessible up the 152 Road via FSR 4204 by Pothole Tank.

You may purchase a wood cutting permit through any of our district offices M-F 8-4:30 p.m. The forest wants to remind you not to block the highway or forest roads while gathering your wood.

Master Preserver Workshops

After an 11-year absence, extension agents with New Mexico State University's Cooperative Extension Service are reviving a program aimed at helping people become master food preservers. The program will be offered in Silver City Tuesday, August 8, 15, 22, and Sept 5.

Interest in food preservation is popular among New Mexico residents. The six classes in the series discuss topics such as water bath canning, jams and jellies, pickles, salsa, fruit and tomatoes, pressure canning vegetables, and freezing and drying. The cost of the workshops is \$150 for volunteers who offer to teach after the workshop, and \$200 for those just wanting the education. Students can take home some of the foods they've preserved.

Nancy Flores, an extension food technology specialist at NMSU's College of Agricultural, Consumer and Environmental Sciences, said the courses are important because many consumers are receiving information online for food preservation methods that may not be safe.

Extension agents "are the best source for methods for canning, dehydration and freezing that could be used for home preparation," Flores said. "We reviewed methods and did hands-on processing of pressure canning of green beans and green chile, and waterbath canning of salsa, diced tomatoes, jams and jelly. Additionally, we dried beef jerky, pineapple, strawberry leather, bananas and green beans, and froze strawberries."




note to the Boosters at Box 512, Mimbres, NM 88049. Or if you run into one of us around the area, let us hear from you.






Now at the Mimbres Culture Heritage Site Mimbres Edition of Archaeology Southwest Magazine

Mimbres Archaeologists Dr. Patricia Gilman and Roger Anyon, recently visited the Mimbres Culture Heritage Site (MCHS) and met with all the summer field school archaeologists and students staying at MCHS. 

Teen Ink By Ajalaa Claussen



Peregrine Falcon

This beautiful falcon, a raptor known for its speed, grace

and power in the air, has been admired as a bird hunter and used by falconers for centuries. Peregrines occur almost worldwide and its name means "wanderer". Adults have a dark head and nape, with a dark "moustache". Females are larger than males. Fifteen to twenty




inches in length, with pointed wings and a streamlined body, it can reach speeds over 200 miles per hour when diving. The peregrine feeds on birds taken in flight and occasionally on rodents and bats. They nest on rocky cliffs high above canyon floors. Previous widespread use of DDT and other pesticides has greatly reduced the world-wide population of peregrine falcons, but many populations are recovering. In New Mexico peregrines are a threatened species.

Where was Conejo Mimbreño in July

In July, I watched as more and more hummingbirds arrived in the Mimbres Valley. I saw magnificent, broad tailed, and black-chinned hummingbirds. Then the Rufous arrived and tried to chase the others away. Hummingbirds migrate as far north as Alaska in the early spring to their breeding areas before returning south. Did you know hummingbird eggs are the size of a small pinto bean? Or that the Mimbres Indians left behind painted pottery images of the amazing tiny birds. I wonder, did those lon-ago people celebrate the return of the hummingbirds to Mimbres each summer?

I will be at the **Hummingbird Festival at the Mimbres Culture Heritage Site Aug. 5** and 6 to watch the hummers and to learn more about the little birds. See you there!
