Christine has been promising to write an article for the Messenger for months, and appropriately she sent it in time for the May issue. Therefore, this issue is our tribute to Mother's Day.

Mom vs. German "Buzz Bombs", England, 1944

My mother, Helen Muir Cunningham, was born in Cumnock, Scotland. During WWII she enlisted in the British RAF and was assigned to operate 'anti air craft' gun to shoot down German "buzz bombs". When she was 15 years old she begged her mother, Ella, to sign the papers stating that she was 16 in order to join the fighting Forces. Cumnock, Scotland had only coal mining and small shops in which to work. Her only alterative (in her mind) was to marry a coal miner. Her mother signed reluctantly and Mom was on the way to England to join the RAF, leaving her mother, father and two younger sisters Chrissy and Margaret.

It must have been strange for her to come to such a 'large' thriving city, more people than she had ever seen in one spot in her life. But this was not peace time and the British were bent on not having the Germans/Nazi's invade England as they had already done in so many European countries. Having been assigned to the 'field artillery', which many woman were, she found herself shooting down the V-1 flying bombs, commonly known as the "buzz bomb". Her mate/friend from England was also a girl looking to make her mark in the fighting of the war. So together they "manned up" and took their posts with honor. My mother had told me that when they shot at the V-1 it was so loud that it burst one of her ear drums (for which she was later compensated by the British Army).

The British defense against the German long-range weapons was Operation Crossbow. Antiaircraft guns of the Royal Artillery and RAF Regiment were redeployed in several movements to shoot down the "buzz bomb".

During this time in her life mother met my father, Treadwell Stonestreet Bailey, who was in the Navy and had

gone ashore at the Battle of Normandy. You can imagine a 'romance' pursued and that they were indeed married in London. Mom was on her way to America as a GI war bride, but had to wait 6 months before she was allowed to climb up the ramp to the Saturnia Italian Liner to start her new life. This was a woman who instilled "no fear" of life and the strength to carry on which has transformed me into the person I am today.

The V-1 was the first of the so-called "Vengeance weapons" series designed for terror bombing of London. It was developed at Peenemünde Army Research Center in 1939 by the Nazi German Luftwaffe during the Second World War. During initial development it was known by the code name "Cherry Stone". Because of its limited range, the thousands of V-1 missiles launched into England were fired from launch facilities along the French (Pas-de-Calais) and Dutch coasts. The first V-1 was launched at London on 13 June 1944, one week after the successful Allied landings in Europe. At peak, more than one hundred V-1s a day were fired at south-east England, 9,521 in total, decreasing in number as sites were overrun until October 1944, when the last V-1 site in range of Britain was overrun by Allied forces. After this, the V-1s were directed at the port of Antwerp and other targets in Belgium, with 2,448 V-1s being launched. The attacks stopped only a month before the war in Europe ended, when the last launch site in the Low Countries was overrun on 29 March 1945.

NEW MEDICARE CARDS

Last month we described the plan to issue new Medicare cards to everyone who has Medicare. These new cards will not show your Social Security number, in an effort to provide identity theft protection, but rather a Health Insurance Claim Number. (HICN).

As seems to be the case recently, yet another opportunity for scammers to act has already been detected. This involves phone calls from people purporting to be from Medicare, asking that you verify your Social Security number to make sure you get you new card, that you owe a fee for the new card, or that you are due to receive a premium refund and requesting that you provide your bank account information. None of this is legitimate. Medicare, like the IRS, does NOT contact you by telephone. If you receive a call like any of the foregoing, Hang Up. Do not answer any questions from callers.

Most Social Security/Medicare recipients have direct deposit to their bank accounts, and mailing addresses may be out of date – if you have moved, or your address has otherwise changed. If you need to correct your address, you can go online at SocialSecurityatssa.gov/my account or call **1-800-772-1213** to be sure your card will be mailed to your correct address.

The schedule for mailing new Medicare cards to New Mexico residents is scheduled to begin in June.



FERMENTED FOODS

The Process of Culturing Foods [Part 2]

The produce:

To attain the best ferments, the produce should be fresh, local and/or organic. Just as in cooking, the finished product will only be as good as its ingredients. Most vegetables, fruits, nuts, milk products or sweet liquids can be fermented. Combining fresh vegetables will create multiple textures, flavors and a wider variety of beneficial bacteria. Cabbage is one of the easiest to ferment. Other vegetables, that are easy to culture, are beets, carrots, daikon, radish and turnips.

The additives:

Salt: either pure sea salt or rock salt [as in Himalayan salt] or pickling salt [do not use salt with iodine or anti-caking agents]; Water: clean non-chlorinated filtered or spring water; Cultures as needed.

The equipment:

A wide-mouth glass jar, or a ceramic or clear plastic crock; a fermentation airlock [recommended] or a wide-mouth

plastic lid [the jar will need to be 'burped' each day]; one or two glass weight or a small jar filled with water that will fit inside the bigger jar; a sharp knife, or grater, or slicer, or shredder; a tamper [a hardwood dowel, 18 inches long, 1.25 to 1.5 inches in diameter, works fine and can also be used as a rolling pin]. Also useful: a cutting board; a large stainless or ceramic bowl; longhandled tongs; a canning funnel.

The fermenting process for vegetables:

All the equipment must be squeaky clean.

After washing the produce in non-chlorinated water and removing any blemish, cut, slice, shred or chop the vegetables. Place the uniform pieces in a bowl, adding small pinches of salt now and then.

Toss the vegetables to ensure the salt is spread out evenly. Any spices and/or herbs may be added at that time.

Let the vegetables sit until the salt draws the liquid out of them [from half an hour to one full day].

Squeeze the veggies to help release the juice. Keep the liquid.



Bridge Work on Forrest Road 150 Complete

The bridge work on Forest Road 150 is now complete. Bridge work began in March, 2017 and the bridges are now open to all traffic. The Black Canyon Bridge and the East Indian Creek Bridge are brand new and the Black Canyon Tributary Bridge was rehabilitated. Staging areas have been covered and treated with seed and mulch.

Temporary Closure planned May 6 – 11 at Cosmic Campground National Dark Sky Sanctuary

The Glenwood Ranger District announces that the Cosmic Campground International Dark Sky Sanctuary (CCIDSS) will be temporarily closed beginning May 1 at 1:00 pm to May 11 at 1:00 pm for extensive improvements.

The CCIDSS is the first international Dark Sky Sanctuary in New Mexico and the first in North America. Many improvements to the site will be conducted, including road surfacing, a perimeter of boulders will be created, the interior of which will create six RV sites.

Gila National Forest Moves to HIGH Fire Danger

Warmer temperatures and high spring winds are increasing the fire danger on the Gila National Forest. Fire crews and forest visitors have been reporting an increase in abandoned campfires in and around the Gila National Forest.

A fire danger rating of **HIGH** is: "all fine dead fuels ignite readily and fires start easily from most causes." Unattended brush and camp fires are likely to escape. Fires spread rapidly and short-distance spotting is common. Fires may become serious and their control difficult unless they are attacked successfully while small. **Outdoor burning should be restricted.**

Fire managers consider several factors when elevating fire danger level. As live fuels cure and dead fuels dry, it is possible to evaluate and calculate these factors and use the calculations as a decision tool to prepare for an approaching fire season. In addition to collected data, the number of human-caused fires, red flag and critical fire days are considered.

Be vigilant of the high winds and rising temperatures and avoid using anything with an open flame or a spark.

If mowing grass down, use a string-style trimmer rather than a lawn mower as the blades can strike rock and produce a spark. Make sure that your chain saw has a spark arrestor, that your trailer chains are not dragging and that all cigarettes are extinguished in an ashtray. Please report fires and abandoned campfires to the Silver City Interagency Dispatch at 1-800-538-1644.

Expect Roadblocks Statewide During Hunting & Fishing Seasons

The Department of Game and Fish will conduct roadblocks throughout the state during hunting and fishing seasons to collect harvest data and to detect wildlife law violations.

The 2018 - 2019 hunting and fishing season began April 1st. All hunters and anglers are required to purchase a new license before hunting and fishing. Anglers can expect roadblocks throughout the summer. Guides and outfitters are reminded that new registration is required. At roadblocks, conservation officers also will check for compliance with the Off-Highway Motor Vehicle Act. Drivers of vehicles hauling wood products will be asked to produce documentation as required by the Forest Conservation Act.

Department officers may be assisted by other law enforcement agencies (US Forest Service, Bureau of Land Management, NM State Police or county sheriffs). As a result, the public may encounter minor delays. Consult the department's Hunting Rules & Information booklet, available at www.wildlife.state.nm.us or at area offices and license vendors.

Everyone is encouraged to report any wildlife crime or suspected crime they see while enjoying New Mexico's great outdoors. To report a wildlife crime, please call Operation Game Thief toll free at 1-800-432-GAME (4263). Callers can remain anonymous and earn rewards for information leading to charges being filed. Violations can also be reported online at Operation Game Thief.

Tightly pack the veggies in the fermenting vessel, tamping them down as you go.

Cover the veggies with the reserved liquid. Add brine from previous ferments if any is available. Insert glass weight. Add fresh brine if needed, until all the produce is covered by liquid, to prevent 'scum' from forming.

Seal top of jar with a fermenting lock. Most fermented foods will need to let gases escape during the anaerobic [air-less] process. Write the starting date on the jar.

Ferment it!

After 24 hours, bubbles may rise to the surface. After a week, the escaping gases will start to smell sour. Young ferments may be ready in a week. Mature ferments may take a couple of months. It's a matter of taste.

When ready, remove the airlock and the weight. Top with a non-metallic lid. Refrigerate to stop fermentation. Most cultured foods will last for weeks under refrigeration.

Tips:

- Warm climate will speed up the culturing process. Cold climate will slow it down. The whole fermenting container may be placed in an insulated bag to maintain a fairly constant temperature.
- To make 1 quart of fresh brine, dissolve a scant tablespoon of salt in one cup of boiling water. Stir and add 3 cups cold filtered water.
- To burp a solid lidded jar, slightly twist the lid until gases escape. Immediately seal jar again before harmful bacteria or molds invade.
- Should a white scum form near the top, try to remove most of it.
- Mold [but not scum] is unacceptable, and moldy foods should be discarded. Harmful bacteria or dirt have invaded the culture.
- Salt and cultures will oxidize non-stainless metal and should not be used during the culturing process.
