"Diamonds in the Rough"

Baseball Symposium Coming to Historic Fort Bayard

A century ago, the sports world was shaken by scandal, the "fixing" of the World Series by members of the Chicago White Sox, who allegedly conspired with professional gamblers to lose to a much inferior Cincinnati Reds team in the Fall Classic.

Since then, books, movies, and countless articles have examined the events leading up to and following the scandal. The effects on all professional sports are still felt today, with efforts to regulate wagering on the events still a major concern.

A much lesser known aspect of the so-called "Black Sox Scandal", is what happened to the eight players banned from professional baseball as a result. It turns out that several of them came right here to the Southwest, and played for teams in the Copper League, which earned that organization a nickname: The Outlaw League. Some of them wore the uniform of the Fort Bayard Veterans.

The Fort Bayard Historic Preservation Society is hosting a three day celebration of the legacy of the sport of baseball to the Southwest. The story of the banned players and their participation in the Copper League is just one topic that will be explored by a panel of schol-

ars, coaches, and players.

The Symposium will "play ball" starting at 6:00 p.m. on Friday evening, October 18th, with an opening reception at the New Deal Theater, on the grounds of Fort Bayard National Historic Landmark, six miles east of Silver City. Activities will include a meet and greet with participants and a chance to view photos and artifacts from local collections.

On Saturday, October 19th, the panel presentations will begin at 9 a.m. in the Theater. Following a break, the presentations will continue from 12:30 until 2:30 p.m. Then, at 3 p.m., two teams will square off on the diamond at nearby Bataan Park. The game will be played according to nineteenth century rules, and will feature a visiting squad of players from the Arizona Vintage Baseball League, taking on the Grant County Senior Olympics baseball team,

coached by well known Senior Olympian Mario Quintana. On Saturday evening, the day's activities will conclude with the screening of the critically ac-

Take a look at the picture on Page 3. Don't you just love the guy on the far right. Do you suppose they couldn't get a uniform large enough to fit him!

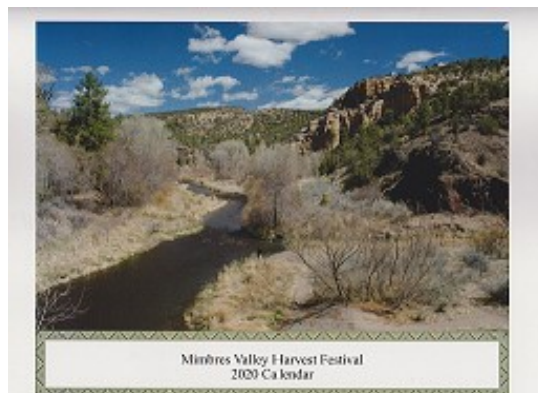
TERRIFIC KID AWARDS

TAKE ME OUT TO THE BALLGAME

Since this issue of the *Messenger* seems to have a baseball theme, I thought I would take this opportunity to expound on one of my pet peeves—the price of tickets to professional baseball games. My hypothesis is that ticket prices have increased so much, that it makes it almost prohibitive to take your kids to a game.

Because I lived in Boston for 30 years, the Boston Red Sox at Fenway Park is the team I know best and therefore will be the focus of my tirade. The official MBL Red Sox site online hasn't listed its 2020 ticket prices yet, so I used vividseats.com (which was the lowest prices I could find) to start my research. I know that Fenway Park is one of the most expensive in the league, but even I had sticker shock. Since every game has different pricing (depending on what team they are playing), I decided to just pick a couple of games and find the "lowest price ticket" and the "highest ticket price" for that game. On this website you can pick among the seats that are still available for sale

and it will show you the view from that seat. The only problem is that for many games there are presently very few seats available to purchase. This will probably change when the official Red Sox Box Office opens.

The home opening game for the Red Sox for the 2020 season is April 2nd against the Chicago White Sox. Opening day is a real big deal in Boston. It is always a weekday-afternoon game, and everyone lucky enough to have acquired a ticket takes off work to attend. That is, if you consider yourself lucky to have spent \$116 per person for the cheapest bleacher seats in the section we called "nose-bleed-heaven". Or, you could get a better bleacher seat for \$211 per ticket. (We used to get one of these seats on game day for \$2.) Or, you could get a standing-room-only ticket behind the green monster, and you could stand for the entire game for \$219 per ticket. Grandstand seats range

from \$150 to about \$300 per seat. These are not much closer than the bleachers seats, just facing the other direction. Unless you have exceptional super-human eyesight, be sure to bring your binoculars! But if you are a big spender, you can still get a field box seat just past the third base line (there were 2 left on this website) for a mere \$1,187 per seat. The more expensive seats have already been sold out on this website. Usually these seats are purchased by corporations and given out to customers and employees.

Maybe all this doesn't sound too bad, but if you have ever been to Boston in the beginning of April, you know that it is still COLD. It is more like attending a football game instead of a baseball game. High temperatures usually range between 37° to 51°, and it usually rains an average of 15 days in April, so you have a 50% chance of rain. Opening day usually goes something like this: Everyone is in a great mood, delighted to be away from work and happy to be back at Fenway drinking their \$8 per glass beer. By about the 5th inning, if you haven't been able to afford enough beer to keep you fortified, you are freezing and ready to leave the park no matter what you paid for a ticket and finish watching the game at a nearby sports bar where the beers are only five or six dollars.

The second game I selected was an August 1st game against the New York Yankees. At least in August you can go to a night game with just a sweater, and there is a good chance of having great weather. For this particular game, the cheapest bleacher seat was \$169 per person, and an infield box seat was \$1,187 per seat. Since there were no "green monster" seats still available for either of these two games, I had to go to an August 19th game with the Cincinnati Reds to find a

seat available above the green monster wall. These tickets range from \$667 to \$865 per seat. And remember your binoculars, it is farther away than the grandstand seats, but hey, you might catch a home run ball and you can also order a cocktail from a waitress!

You might think I have it in for the Red Sox and Fenway Park, but the fact of the matter is that I loved going to Fenway once or twice a year. Just the high energy level, the roar of the crowd, and eating the hotdogs on a warm summer's night was great fun. I will admit I never cared for opening day, but my husband rarely missed it. If I had to pick the best professional baseball park in the United States, it would be Fenway. Given all this, I still think everything is overpriced. I do not like paying the exorbitant ticket prices, the \$8 for a 12 oz domestic beer (for which I have waited 30 minutes in line and missed the only home run of the game), or \$5.50 for a plain hotdog, or \$45 for a parking spot (a mid-range price).

I know that this website may have higher ticket prices than the official Red Sox box office, but not by that much. I figured that if you went with a family of four to one of these games, bought the cheapest bleacher tickets, a beer for the 2 adults, 2 cokes for the kids, 4 hotdogs and paid to park, it would set you back a minimum of \$555 for one game and realistically, probably more than that. Don't forget the binoculars you will need! If you really wanted to see the game, tickets would run you in the \$300 range, which ups the cost to a minimum of \$1,291 for four. Those two vintage baseball games at Bataan Park in October are looking better and better!

Unfortunately, for a lot of people professional baseball isn't within their budget, and their kids never get to experience the thrill of going to a major league game which is something that every kid should get to experience at least once in their lives.

**Additional Free Fuelwood Area Available
on Wilderness Ranger District**

The Gila National Forest, Wilderness Ranger District is pleased to announce an additional temporary fuelwood area available again this fall. The fuelwood is cut and stacked in decks and is a result of the Gatton's Park Collaborative Forest Restoration Program.

You must get a fuelwood permit at either the Wilderness Ranger District in Mimbres or the Silver City Ranger District/Supervisor's Office in Silver City. The fuelwood is available at the Celebrations site -- adjacent to FSR 4078U, off the west side of NM Hwy 35 (between mile post 17 and 18).

**Wilderness Ranger District closes Gatton's Park
Temporary Fuelwood Area for Public Safety**

The Gila National Forest, Wilderness Ranger District is closing the Gatton's Park, Unit 4 temporary fuelwood area on **September 16** for public safety.

The Gatton's Park, Unit 4 is under use by a contractor through the Collaborative Forest Restoration Project and was temporarily available during the summer. The contractor will begin work again during the fall and will have heavy equipment in the unit thinning as part of improving forest health, reducing fuels in and around the Upper Mimbres area, and improving wildlife habitat.

The public is being reminded to stay out of the area for their safety, and the safety of the contractor working in the unit.

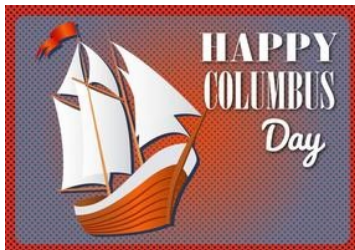

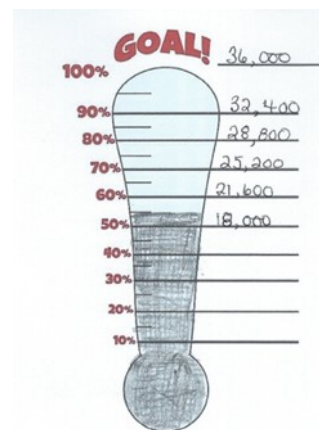

Activities included grinding corn on a metate, whirling a bull roarer, making yucca fiber, and sketching potsherds, broken pieces of Mimbres pottery.



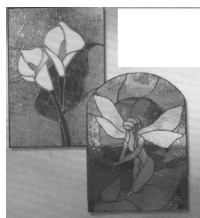

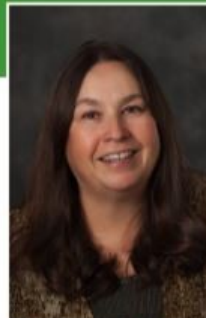

Conejo Mimbrenño Visits Río Grande del Norte National Monument

The ninth in our series highlighting New Mexico National Parks and Monuments

By Marilyn Markel

Río Grande del Norte National Monument in north central New Mexico contains rugged, wide open plains at an average elevation of 7,000 feet above sea level. It is dotted by many extinct volcanic cones, along with deep cutting canyons with rivers tucked away in their depths. Ute Mountain is the highest volcanic cone reaching over 10,000 feet in elevation. The Río Grande, the longest river in the state, created an 800-foot gorge by cutting through layers of basalt flows and ash.

This area has attracted human activity since prehistoric times. Evidence for this activity includes petroglyphs, rock art carved on boulders and along cliffs, prehistoric dwelling sites, and artifacts. Whitewater rafting, fishing, hiking, camping, and mountain biking are popular activities today. Río Grande del Norte became a national monument in 2013.



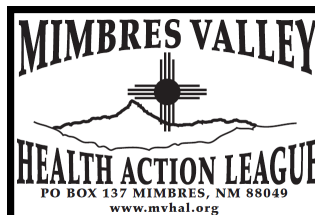
